Chromapost is an ongoing nano-blogging online diary where every post consists of a single color picked with the RGB color picker. Each color is an attempt to summarize a day in the author's life.

The main assumption of the project is that color generates a complex network of meanings, and that human attachment to color is emotionally charged. In this regard Chromapost delves into the realm of negotiation between the social and the personal. To what extent can I express myself with color in a unique and personal way that ignores aestheticizing and the cultural constraints about the meaning of color?

The selected sequences of such colors are used in "Chromapost outgrowths", a series of artworks where the colors contained in the online diary are translated using different media. Since the original color is basically computer data, every manifestation of the color is a translation, and will appear differently in each medium through which it has been manifested. The outgrowths are grouped into three sets of artworks depending on the approach used for color translation.

One set of artworks uses color in its original manifestation, on screen. A second set is "Reproductions" with outgrowths that reproduce colors in different media as accurately as possible through printing or careful mixing of pigment or paint. In a third set, "Translations", the original Chromapost colors are translated with limited and predefined sets of colors in various materials, from art supply sets to stationery, craft materials, toys and magazines. In this third case, colors are not mixed, but approximated through the manufacturer's color choice. The outgrowths in the below portfolio contain examples from both "Reproductions" and "Translations".

All of the outgrowths are sequences of colors from the Chromapost blog in chronological order. The elements of a sequence are either arranged linearly (from left to right or top to bottom), in a grid (from upper left corner to lower right corner), or based on calendar distribution of dates.

Some of the compositions are based on the data analysis of colors (RGB or HSB values).

Chromapost rules:
One chromapost per day, every day.
No white (FFFFFF) or black (000000).
The title of every post is the hexadecimal code of the color.








A sequence of chromaposts starting from the left-hand side. Translation with a set of 24 Liquitex Basic Acrylic unmixed paints.
















# **Chromapost Translations**



### **Chromapost Sound**

Java application



Desktop Java applet that translates color into sound.

The translation is based on converting red, green and blue color values (0 - 255 each) to MIDI values (21 - 108). There are three types of conversion: a single tone (based on the approximated lightness of color), a chord (red, green and blue values are translated into tones that are played at the same time), and a broken chord (same as a chord, except that the tones are played in quick succession).


















